## PROPOSITION 124

### PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE ARIZONA CONSTITUTION BY THE LEGISLATURE RELATING TO PUBLIC RETIREMENT SYSTEMS

#### OFFICIAL TITLE

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF ARIZONA; AMENDING ARTICLE XXIX, SECTION 1, CONSTITUTION OF ARIZONA; RELATING TO PUBLIC RETIREMENT SYSTEMS.

#### DESCRIPTIVE TITLE

THE PROPOSITION AND ACCOMPANYING LEGISLATION PERMIT THE STATE TO ADJUST CERTAIN BENEFITS IN THE PUBLIC SAFETY PERSONNEL RETIREMENT SYSTEM TO ALLEVIATE SYSTEM UNDERFUNDING, INCLUDING THE REPLACEMENT OF THE CURRENT PERMANENT BENEFIT INCREASE STRUCTURE WITH A COST OF LIVING ADJUSTMENT THAT IS INDEXED FOR INFLATION, CAPPED AT 2% PER YEAR.

A "YES" vote will allow the state to adjust certain benefits for public safety retirees, including the replacement of the current permanent benefit increase structure with a cost of living adjustment based on inflation, capped at 2% per year.	<b>YES</b>
A "NO" vote shall have the effect of maintaining the current benefit increase structure in the underfunded Public Safety Personnel Retirement System and prohibiting the proposed legislative adjustment intended to stabilize the system.	<b>NO</b>
